If you blogged about this event, do post a link to it under the hashtag. We are interested to know your experience and learn if there are anything that we can do better.






UCTI, Technology Park Malaysia Bukit Jalil, KL, Malaysia

# Good things to know



#### What is FUDCon

FUDCon is the Fedora Users and Developers Conference, a major free software event held in various regions around the world, usually annually per region. FUDCon is a combination of sessions, talks, workshops, and hackfests. FUDCon is always FREE to attend for anyone in the world.

#### **FUDPub**

FUDPub is a social night held during a FUDCon. For FUDCon Kuala Lumpur, we will be having a dinner on saturday night. Seats are limited to 50 however, so it is by invitation only. Be actively contributing throughout FUDCon and you may get a chance to be invited!

# Hangout & Exhibition Room

We have one room allocated for hangout and exhibition. If the talks are of no interest to you, do hangout in the hangout room.

Local communities who wish to have a desk there for exhibition or other activities, please contact the organizing team and we'll arrange one for you if the space permit.

#### Blogging

If you are writing blog posts about FUDCon, we welcome you to join us on Fedora Planet requires a FAS account that has signed the CLA and is approved for one additional group. If you are new to Fedora but know someone who would be willing to add your blog to Planet, ask them.

If you were sponsored to come to FUDCon, we request that you write at least one blog post for Planet. planet.fedoraproject.org

#### IRC Channel

FUDCon main IRC channel on Freenode is **#fedora-fudcon** and Fedora Malaysia IRC channel is **#fedora-my**. If you are transcribing a session, pleas report the session nam and IRC channel to the main channel. If you are using Gobby or EtherPad in your hackfest, pleas make a note of this in the main channel as well

# Good things to know



#### What's a BarCamp conference?

Parts of FUDCon Kuala Lumpur (especially Day 1) is organized in an ad-hoc fashion, inspired by BarCamp events (http://www.barcamp.org)

BarCamps are participant-driven events, and anyone who wants to run a session is invited to do a pitch. Your pitch advertises your talk and convinces other people to vote for it and attend.

After the pitches, conference participants will quickly vote on which pitches they would like to see the most. The session titles will be posted on the wall on pieces of paper. Each participant should make a vote mark on the session proposals that interset the the most, marking as many proposals as they like. Voting allow the organizers and participants to reduce conflicts, combine two like subjects, or remove sessions with low interest.

Scheduling of sessions is also a collaborative effort. Speakers and attendees work with each other to eliminate conflicts and produce a logical schedule. Once the schedule is completed, it is transcribed to the wiki for everyone's reference.

We only have 60 minutes for the introduction, pitches and scheduling, so it is incredibly important that we start on time at and that we stay on topic and on our schedule.

The Rule of Two Feet is encouraged. This rule is simple: You are not required to stay in a session that loses your interest. If you find the presentation is not what you thought it would be, use your two feet to find an alternative session. If you'd like a session leader to cover a different kind of material, ask them about it. (Nicely, of course - we value courtesy along with flexibility)

Sound confusing? In principle, you'd be right. In practice, though, this process results in a dynamic engaging ad information-packed event. The combination of collaboration, flexibility and user-driven content makes it nearly impossible to leave the conference dissatisfied. Once you've experienced a BarCamp style event, you may find you enjoy it more than other formats!


